Current Research

In a study by Boston University School of Public Health, researchers found single questions that doctors could ask to find out patients level of dependence on drugs and alcohol. For alcohol dependence, the question asked was how many times in the past year they had consumed five or more drinks in a day (for men), and four or more (for women). To screen for other substance use, the question "How many times in the past year have you used an illegal drug or prescription medication for non medical reasons?" The single questions screening detected 88% of individuals with alcohol dependence and 97% of individuals with substance dependence.


Family Therapy Clinic at ECU honors Air Force Partnership
