



Bystanders are:

Friends, Family, Classmates, Teammates, Co-workers, anyone with a ...relationship with an individual who is harassing, abusive, or violent or who is the victim.

Mentors in Violence Prevention

- DTFDV and the Marine Corps.....and more!
- Logic of creating an approach to prevention that is inviting to men gently and creatively
- Encourage people to speak out before, during and after the fact, contributing to decline in acceptance of the conduct while noting that "silence equals consent"
- *Replicate-able*, possible for other communities and groups to learn how to reach bystanders too
