Example of how “anonymous” client level information is not actually anonymous.

Client-level data is extremely identifying and would breach most state advocate confidentiality laws

The next example has an “encoded” Name and Social Security number, though the client-level information is extraordinarily identifying – as is the Date of Birth. Also, this survivor’s information would be linked to her other records in the central server – breaching confidentiality and putting her safety at risk.
