Violence against women results in physical and emotional harm. Without a doubt, women who have been victimized need appropriate services and responses. There is a growing body of evidence that, in fact, violence against women can be prevented with effective primary prevention approaches that address the underlying factors that contribute to violence against women, such as gender norms.
