The purpose of this article was to present the iRelate program and preliminary data from the program. The iRelate program is a 3-stage psychoeducational comprehensive intimate relationship training program created by Navy chaplains. This program was intended to prepare Marines for healthy relationships and marriages and to strengthen existing ones. The aims of this program are to increase the general and psychological well-being of Marines, reduce divorce rates and suicide-related behaviors, and increase unit readiness. Results from the pilot study showed that prior to beginning the program, Marines reported high levels of marriage idealism and overconfidence. After the training, Marines developed more realistic expectations for marriage and reported feeling more prepared for their marriage.
