SPECIAL VICTIMS' COUNSEL

A lawyer is dedicated to represent the victim A lawyer is decired in legal proceedings



EXPEDITED TRANSFER

The victim may request to be transferred from their current unit of assignment



NON-RATED PERIOD

Victims may elect to have a non-rated period



NON-MEDICAL ESCORTS

Victims may have an Air Force-funded escort to trial and testimony for emotional support


